PALMER AUTO MUSEUM FOR SUNSHINE COAST (taken from Spoke'n'Hub Torque Newsletter #3

The billionaire mining tycoon and former politician Clive Parker plans to open Palmer Auto Museum at his golf course resort on the Sunshine Coast. His car museum backfired first time around but perhaps going bigger will be better?

The proposed museum will be able to display up to 980 cars and 363 motorcycles, along with lobby, a special display zone and an upper-level terrace. In contract, the museum car park will only cater for 516 cars and just 42 motorcycles. If approved, the new Palmer Auto Museum will be built over the golf resort's existing golf driving range, meaning they will heed to relocate the range to another precinct.

The museum will collect, research, preserve and display some of the rarest working vintage cars from around the world. Palmer purchased the former Hyatt Regency Coolum resort in 2001 before closing the facility in 2015. Reports are that Palmers current collections stands at more than 150 vehicles, including 17 rare vehicles purchased at a Denmark auction in 2016.

1954 Oldsmobile F-88 Concept Car









The Oldsmobile F-88 Concept Car, known as the XP -20 project, made its debut on January 21, 1954, at General Motors Motorama in New York at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel.

The preliminary sketches were created by veteran designer Bill Lange with the final designs performed in the main Oldsmobile studio under the direction of Art Ross. It is believed that three or four design studies were built and each was slightly different, but all had concealed folding tops.

The sole surviving example was known by its styling order #2265. The Oldsmobile F-88 Dream Car rested on the 102" wheelbase platform of the Chevrolet Corvette and Pontiac Bonneville Special, the F-88's body was made from fiberglass. Beneath the bonnet was a 324 cubic inch Super 88 V8 engine with a four-barrel carburettor, with a small, flat air cleaner. The engine was paired with a four-speed Hydra-Matic transmission and used a 3.55:1 rear axle ratio derived from the Corvette. The instrumental panel, later used on a Cutlass, was from the 1953 Oldsmobile and included a tachometer. V8 Rocket Displacement: 5309cc, 324.0 cu in, 5.3L, Power: 250 BHP (184KW).

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
